## Elmhurst Public Library Ranks High Again in National Index

Elmhurst Public Library has been named one of the top ten public libraries in its category nationwide according to the 2009 Hennen's American Public Library Rating (HAPLR) Index.

This is the fifth consecutive year the library has been ranked in the top ten by the HAPLR Index. EPL was compared to 943 other public libraries across the nation with similar populations and was ranked in the 99th percentile. In Illinois, EPL is the top-rated library of the 69 in its category.

The HAPLR Index focuses on 15 factors, including circulation, staffing, materials, reference service and funding levels. More information is available at the HAPLR web site. <http://www.haplr-index.com>

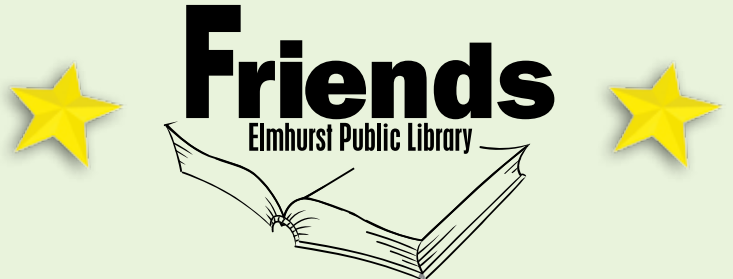

lecture on how World War I was an absurd conflict fought to a bitter and destructive end by countries with no convincing reason to fight. After rushing into a military quagmire, an entire continent fought bitterly until four empires collapsed, a revolutionary government established itself in the world's largest country, the door opened to ideological fanatics, and a second world war became inevitable.

### America at War: World War I

On Veterans Day, EPL shows a documentary film about the First World War. Part one explains the circumstances that triggered the First World War and how the stage was set for even deadlier conflicts. Part two of the film, *The Last Day of World War I* explains how on November 11, 1918, known as Armistice Day, the "Great War" was declared over and Allied victory seemed assured. Yet thousands of men would die that day. Allied leaders seeking promotion or vengeance manufactured outrageous excuses to send more troops against a defeated enemy. The territories won would be returned to Germany, while the soldiers were sacrificed for vanity. Based on the book *11th Month, 11th Day, 11th Hour* by Joseph Persico.

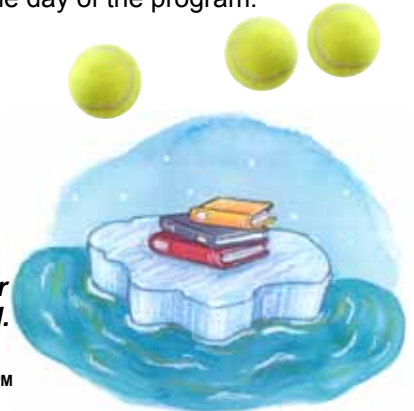

The library reserves the right to cancel a computer class due to insufficient enrollment (less than five students). If a class is cancelled by the library, students will be notified at least 48 hours in advance and will be rescheduled or given a voucher for a future computer class.

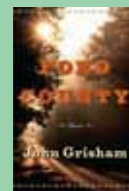

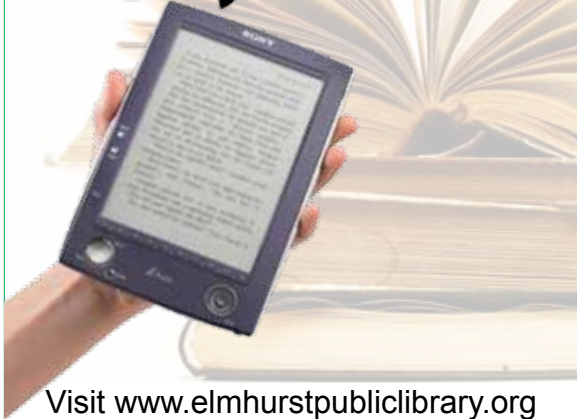

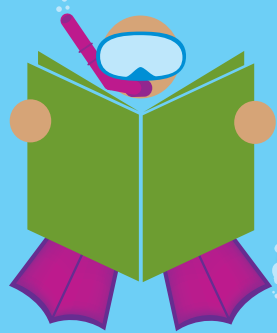
